The Town sends numerous letters to residents found in violation of the weed abatement code throughout the year. Property owners are urged to keep weeds and overgrown vegetation to a minimum. Failure to comply with the Municipal Code regulations may result in Code Enforcement action. Weed abatement can be accomplished by hand trimming and mowing. Regular landscape maintenance can minimize weed growth through responsible, preventative herbicide application.
